

Parliament Assembly

On the 20th of February 2024, a visitor called Nikki came to our assembly to teach us about Parliament. Although much of the information was new to us, she made the session interactive and there were challenges along the way to check our knowledge. We learnt about the two Houses: the House of Commons and the House of Lords. The House of Commons is green whereas the House of Lords is red. There are 650 elected members of the House of Commons. They are called MPs (Members of Parliament). Our MP is David Evennett.

In the House of Lords, there are 785 sitting members currently. The people of the House of Lords are called Lords or Barronesses. The members of the House of Lords are appointed for their skills; they need to have expertise in one particular area. In the House of Lords, there is a balcony where the public can come and view their discussions when making new laws.

We also found out that education, housing and health are the three key areas that Parliament discuss.

We all learned something new and enjoyed it so much.



Spaces available...

At Hillsgrove, children have access to a breakfast and after school club. The morning sessions start at 7.30 until the children are taken into class (£6 per session) and the after school provision is open until 6pm. (£12 per session).

Cherry Tree Kids Clubs are committed to providing an organised, stimulating, safe environment for children from schools in Bexley Borough during out of school hours. The Club has met Ofsted requirements and has received the Sure Start Investors in Children Quality Assurance kite mark, 'Aiming High 4 Children'.

The staff will encourage a range of activities which will include sports and team games, arts and crafts, cookery, drama and many more. There is an opportunity for children to do their homework and they will have access to encyclopedias, dictionaries and other reference books.

Cherry Tree Kids Clubs will employ an adequate number of staff with a recognised child care qualification and experienced volunteers who have all undertaken recent medical and police checks. All our staff are first aid trained.
